You **must** mail or bring in a current rabies vaccination certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian. If your dog is spayed or neutered, proof **must** be shown for the reduced price.

According to State Law (Act 339 of 1919) all dogs, four (4) months or older, must be vaccinated against rabies and have a current dog license.
